Numbers: Chapter 20

¹ Then the children of Israel, the whole community, came to the Wilderness of Zin in the first month, and the people dwelt in Kadesh, and Miriam died there and was buried there.

² And there was no water for the community, and they gathered themselves together against Moses and against Aaron. ³ The people argued with Moses, and spoke, saying, “O that we had died when our brothers died before Adonai! ⁴And why have you brought up the community of Adonai into this wilderness, that we and our livestock should die here? ⁵ And why have you brought us up from Egypt, to bring us into this evil place? It is no place of seed, or of figs, or of vines, or of pomegranates. Nor is there any water to drink.”

⁶ Moses and Aaron went from the presence of the community to the door of the tent of meeting, and they fell on their faces, and the glory of God appeared to them. ⁷ Adonai spoke to Moses, saying: ⁸ Take the rod, and gather the community together, you and Aaron your brother, and speak to the rock before their eyes, and it will give its water, and you will bring out to them water from the rock; so you will give the community and their livestock drink.

⁹ So Moses took the rod from before Adonai, as God commanded him. ¹⁰ Moses and Aaron gathered the community before the rock, and he said to them, “Hear now, you rebels. Will we bring out water from this rock for you?” ¹¹ And Moses lifted up his hand, and he struck the rock twice with his rod, and plenty of water came out, and the community drank, and their livestock.

¹² Adonai spoke to Moses and Aaron, “Because you did not believe in Me, to sanctify Me in the eyes of the children of Israel, therefore you will not bring this community into the land which I have given them.”

¹³ This is the water of Meribah because the children of Israel argued with Adonai, and God was sanctified among them.

Judges: Chapter 11

²⁹ The Lord’s spirit empowered Jephthah. He passed through Gilead and Manasseh and went to Mizpah in Gilead. From there he approached the Ammonites. ³⁰ Jephthah made a vow to Adonai, saying, “If You really do hand the Ammonites over to me, ³¹ then whoever is the first to come through the doors of my house to meet me when I return safely from fighting the Ammonites—he will belong to Adonai and I will offer him up as a sacrifice.” ³² Jephthah approached the Ammonites to fight with them, and Adonai handed them over to him.
