Leviticus, Chapter 19

- ¹ Adonai spoke to Moses: ² "Speak to the whole congregation of the Israelites and tell them, 'You must be holy because I, Adonai your God, am holy. ³ Each of you must respect his mother and his father, and you must keep my Sabbaths. I am Adonai your God. ⁴ Do not turn to idols, and you must not make for yourselves gods of cast metal. I am Adonai your God.
- ⁵ When you offer a sacrifice of peace offerings to Adonai, you shall offer it so that you might be accepted. ⁶ It shall be eaten the same day you offer it or on the next day, and if any remains until the third day, it shall be burned in the fire. ⁷ If it is eaten at all on the third day, then it is contaminated. It shall not be accepted. ⁸ Therefore everyone who eats it shall bear his sin, because he has defiled what is holy of Adonai, and that person shall be cut off from among his people.
- ⁹ "When you gather in the harvest of your land, you must not completely harvest the corner of your field, and you must not gather up the gleanings of your harvest. ¹⁰ You must not pick your vineyard bare, and you must not gather up the fallen grapes of your vineyard. You must leave them for the poor and the foreigner. I am Adonai your God.
- ¹¹ "You must not steal, you must not tell lies, and you must not deal falsely with your fellow citizen. ¹² You must not swear falsely in My Name, so that you do not profane the Name of your God. I am Adonai. ¹³ You must not oppress your neighbor or commit robbery against him. You must not withhold the wages of the hired laborer overnight until morning. ¹⁴ You must not curse a deaf person or put a stumbling block in front of a blind person. You must fear your God; I am Adonai. ¹⁵ "You must not deal unjustly in judgment: you must neither show partiality to the poor nor honor the rich. You must judge your fellow citizen fairly.

Amos, Chapter 9

¹³ "Be sure of this, the time is coming," says Adonai, "when the plowman will catch up to the reaper and the one who stomps the grapes will overtake the planter. Juice will run down the slopes, it will flow down all the hillsides. ¹⁴ I will bring back my people, Israel; they will rebuild the cities lying in rubble and settle down. They will plant vineyards and drink the wine they produce; they will grow orchards and eat the fruit they produce. ¹⁵ I will plant them on their land and they will never again be uprooted from the land I have given them," says Adonai your God.
