Exodus, Chapter 23

¹ You must not give a false report. Do not join your hand with the wicked to be a malicious witness.

² You must not follow a crowd in doing evil things; in a lawsuit you must not offer testimony that agrees with a crowd so as to pervert justice, ³ and you must not show partiality to a poor man in his lawsuit.

⁴ If you encounter your enemy's ox or donkey wandering off, you must by all means return it to him.

⁵ If you see the donkey of someone who hates you fallen under its load, you must not ignore him, but be sure to help him with it.

⁶ You must not turn away justice for your poor people in their lawsuits. ⁷ Keep your distance from a false charge—do not kill the innocent and the righteous, for I will not justify the wicked. ⁸ You must not accept a bribe, for a bribe blinds those who see and subverts the words of the righteous. ⁹ Also you shall not oppress a stranger, for you know the life of a stranger, seeing you were strangers in the land of Egypt.

¹⁰ You shall sow your land for six years and shall gather in its produce, ¹¹ but in the seventh year you shall let it rest and lie fallow, so that the poor of your people may eat, and what they leave, the beasts of the field may eat. You shall do likewise with your vineyard and with your olive grove.

¹² For six days you are to do your work, but on the seventh day you must cease, so that your ox and your donkey may rest, and the son of your female servant and the stranger may refresh themselves.

¹³ In all things that I have said to you, watch yourselves, and do not mention the names of other gods, nor let them be heard from your mouth.

Jeremiah, Chapter 33

²⁵ But I, Adonai, make the following promise: I have made a covenant governing the coming of day and night. I have established the fixed laws governing heaven and earth. ²⁶ Just as surely as I have done this, so surely will I never reject the descendants of Jacob. Nor will I ever refuse to choose one of my servant David's descendants to rule over the descendants of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob. Indeed, I will restore them and show mercy to them."
