FROM THE CLERGY

During the month of July, we will be reading about the most serious challenge to Moses' leadership during the 40 years of wandering in the desert: The rebellion of Korach.

Korach, who was a Levite, along with Dathan and Abiram, two leaders within the camp, and 250 elders, rise together to challenge the leadership of Moses. They claim that they have an equal right to lead since everyone in the community is holy. Moses responds by telling Korach and the others to bring their fire pans the next day and lay incense on them: God will decide who should lead.

When the hour of the test arrives, Korach gathers all the People to observe the event, trying to turn his attempted revolt into an attempted revolution. The text makes it clear that the congregation plays no part in what happens. Only Korach, Dathan, Abiram, Moses and Aaron are mentioned by name; the People have been called by Korach only to witness. Yet, God speaks to Moses, saying, "Stand back from this community that I may annihilate them in an instant!"

Now, my question is, why did God want to destroy the entire nation in the first place? What did they do? In his book, "Torah Concepts: The Source of Jewish Values," Rabbi Joe Radinsky points to a commentary by Meir Lob Ben Yehiel Michal, otherwise known as the Malbim, which says that the people, in fact, were guilty of a great sin. "They had committed the sin of fence-straddling, the sin of indifference." The text does not in any way suggest that the people supported Korach, but they didn't oppose him either. If Moses should win, they'd continue to work with him. If Korach should win, they'd work with him. They saw their community threatened, but they didn't want to get involved. It was for this that God wanted to destroy them - for not taking a stand.

Now, while I doubt that any of us will ever face such a challenge as Moses and the Children of Israel, I do think that many of us frequently face situations that demand a response, even if we do not want to become involved. The reaction of God to Moses tells us very clearly that we, as Jews, must become engaged in our communities. It is our responsibility to take action when called or perhaps take on greater responsibility than initially intended.

So it is that this June, I will be taking on the responsibility of Secretary of the Executive Board of the American Conference of Cantors. This organization exists to support Reform Cantors in their sacred calling as emissaries for Iudaism and Iewish music. As an Officer of the Executive Board, it will be my responsibility to respond to the needs of the membership and the Reform Movement. This will be in addition to my calling to music and prayer and my shared responsibilities for offering spiritual leadership to you, my congregation.

I look forward to a rewarding term of service.

May your summer be filled with health, happiness, and fulfillment.
