FROM RABBI SIMON



Minister: In Thy holy temple, O Lord, all is silent before Thy majesty. We hear Thy voice, O Father of Peace, when the day's strife is past, and the evening spreads repose over creation. But deeper than the twilight calm is the peace which the Sabbath Eve at the close of every week brings to us. Like the dew of [Mt] Hermon falling on Zion, rich with blessing, it gives strength to the body and joy to the soul from the abundance of Thy grace.

Unless you grew up with the Union Prayer Book, originally published 1892, you might

be surprised to know that the preceding reading was a popular option with which to begin the "Service for Sabbath Eve" at Reform congregations throughout the United States. A new version of the "Union Prayer Book" was published almost immediately in 1895, as the 1892 version was too traditional for many of the early reformers, with the "revised" edition published in 1910 and the "newly revised" version published in 1940, each gradually bringing more Hebrew options into the service.

While I'm not sure which version of the "Union Prayer Book" Schaarai Zedek was using when we officially joined the Reform Movement in 1903 (nor do I know what prayer book we were using before then), I know for certain that as foreign as the above text sounds to many of us, for others it brings back

wonderful memories of the "Sabbath Eve" services of their childhood.

When I started at Congregation Schaarai Zedek in 2007, our services were led out of the gray "Gates of Prayer for Shabbat and

Weekdays." Published in 1994, it was an abbreviated and gender-neutral version of the blue "Gates of Prayer," published in 1975, the prayer book with which I grew up.

I remember when Rabbi Birnholz suggested to our board that it was time to make the switch to the new "Mishkan T'filah" prayer book that was published by the Reform Movement in 2007. We were all excited to open ourselves up to the possibilities

of the new prayer book and its layout, but we were also nervous at how our congregation would react to the change. Rabbi Birnholz and I sat down with both prayer books and created a service out of the new prayer book that resembled our current service as much as possible. Sure enough, other than getting used to the new size of the book, the transition went remarkably smooth. To today's b'nai mitzvah students, that 2007 service would seem almost as foreign as the Union Prayer Book does to many of us today.

> Aswe celebrate our congregation's 125th anniversary, we also will celebrate how our worship has changed over those 125 years.

I hope you'll join us at Shabbat services on Friday, October 25, as we'll begin our service in the "Union Prayer Book", moving our way through history to "Mishkan T'filah." The music and language will change throughout the service, but the

value of community that brings us together in worship will not, as we celebrate the community of prayer that Schaarai Zedek has been for 125 years and will continue to be as we move together into the future.

I am excited to be working closely with Rabbi Simon, professional staff, and several congregants on the 125th Anniversary Weekend, celebrating the founding Congregation Schaarai Zedek.

Whether your family has been a member for five generations or has only recently joined our synagogue community, I encourage you to join us on Friday, October 26, and Saturday, October 27, for an exciting weekend of remembering, worshiping, honoring, partying, and looking forward. Saturday evening's program, with David Glickman as our Master of Ceremonies, will feature cocktails and hors d'oeuvres, a short Havdalah service, a delicious buffet-style dinner, music from the decades, and a special short video documenting our collective history. Lest you think this is an all-night affair, the evening's activities are scheduled to end before 10:00 p.m.

I hope to see you there as we come together to celebrate this historic accomplishment as our special CSZ family.

Perpetuating Judaism requires constant renewal. In addition to the wisdom that comes with age, a vibrant Temple community needs the enthusiasm and energy of the young. Recruiting and retaining young members is critically important because young people represent the future of the congregation.

In July 2001, the Board adopted a new dues structure to encourage young adults singles, married couples and families - to affiliate. With the incentive of a sliding scale of affordable dues, we make it attractive for people under age 35 to become active participants in the life of the Temple. During the past years, many young adults have joined the congregation. By making membership affordable, the Young Adult Member Plan has succeeded in bringing new life to our synagogue. Those members under 35 who can afford more than their age-related dues are encouraged to raise their commitment voluntarily through Torah Circle.

The Torah Circle funds enable us to have a Young Adult Member Plan. With this important program, we are helping to establish a fundamental relationship that perpetuates Judaism for generations to come.

The short but long road

"How do I get to that city on the hill?" asked Rabbi Joshua.

He had come to a crossroads in his path, and there was no one around but a little boy sitting there along the road, idly playing. Rabbi Joshua leaned forward at

the waist and spoke to the boy.

"Which path do we take to the city?" he asked, half-bent and with hands on his hips. The boy looked up, seeming to notice the great rabbi, then squinted toward the two paths.

"That one is short," he said, pointing with his chin to the first path, "but long." Nodding briefly to the other, he said, "and that one is long but short." With that, he went back to his playing.

Scoffing, Rabbi Joshua quickly headed down the shorter path. Soon, the city was in view. However, the path began to twist and split until the rabbi saw that he was entirely surrounded by gardens and orchards, with no clear route through to the city on the hill.

He huffed back to where he had started and marched up to the little boy. He pointed a long finger back to the road from which he had come.

"My son, didn't you tell me it was short?"

The boy looked up again at the rabbi in earnest. "And did I not tell you it was long?"

Rabbi Joshua smiled sweetly. The boy was right, after all. He kissed the boy on the head and blessed him: "Happy are you, O Israel, for you are all great and wise, from your great ones to your little ones."

And then he continued on his way. (from Talmud Eruvin 53b)

A new year is now upon us, and we each reflect on the paths of our journey. This strange, short Talmudic tale is full of puzzling events. Why did the little boy seem to speak in riddles? Why did Rabbi Joshua rush down the first path without thinking or asking what the little boy meant? Why was he surprised when the short (but long) path turned out not to be so short?

Taken as a metaphor, we don't have to wonder about this tale because we have all lived it. How often have you found yourself rushing ahead down a path despite an ambiguous endorsement or warning? How often have you found the way ahead obscured and blocked, and then felt like you had to go back to the beginning? I have certainly been there. More than once. Some paths that seem short end up longer than we expected, and some paths that seemed too long or difficult turn out to be shorter than we thought. You may have a skeptical reaction to Rabbi Joshua's anger that things didn't work out as he thought. Yet all too often we are surprised when a setback predictably comes along.

In 125 years of history, Schaarai Zedek has seen our share of unusual paths. They led through a shocking split between the German Jews and their Eastern European counterparts in 1902, through a basement that was more of a swimming pool, and incredible growth into the most exciting synagogue community and preschool in the country. Some roads seemed right in the short run ended up in setbacks, and some roads took a great distance to bear fruit. In the end, our story ends in a joyous celebration. Just as Rabbi Joshua blessed the little boy, we share in the blessings of all the short and long roads that led us here together.






