

#### **FROM RABBI SIMON**

The documentary "Happy," which we'll be watching before our Selichot service on Saturday, September 21, opens with the story of Manoj Singh. Manoj lives in the slums of Kolkata, India, and works twelve

to fourteen hours a day running in the streets, pulling a rickshaw.

"Some passengers abuse us," Manoj explains, "especially those who are drunk, but I never quarrel with them because if I do, then tomorrow they will not ride in my rickshaw. In the summer, my feet and head burn in the heat of the sun. It is painful, but winter and the monsoons don't bother me. Even if my clothes get soaked with rain, I know they will dry when I run with a passenger."

Manoj lives in a house made of plastic bags tied around bamboo sticks. It seems less secure than a tent that we would use for a night of camping, but Manoj describes his home this way:

"My home is good. One side is open, and air flows into the room nicely. A plastic tarp covers the exterior, but one side has a window. During the monsoon, we have some trouble with rain blowing inside. Except for this, we live well."

Then, a giant smile comes to Manoj's face as he continues, "When I return home in the afternoon, my son is sitting at the tea shop waiting for my return. And when he calls out, "BABA!" I am full of joy. When I see my child's face, I feel very happy. I feel that I am not poor, but I am the richest person. Sometimes we eat only rice with salt, but still, we are happy. My neighbors are good. We stay together, and that makes us happy. We are all friends!"

According to researchers in positive psychology, a field that studies those things that allow individuals to thrive rather than focusing on illnesses and instability, Manoj Singh, in spite of the vulnerability and adversity he faces every day, is happier than the average American. It's hard to imagine that someone who works so hard and lives in such conditions could be so happy, but the film shares research that says that only ten percent of our happiness is based on our circumstances - the things we have or don't have, experience or don't experience. According to their research, fifty percent of our happiness is based on genetics, which leaves forty percent up to each of us and the choices we make and the attitudes we develop through conscious work. While our genetics impact the degree, we all can choose the way we perceive our circumstances.

While it's always ok (and a Jewish value) to want to improve ourselves and our condition, it's also important to follow the teaching of Rabbi Ben Zoma in Pirkei Avot. Ben Zoma teaches, "Who is rich? The one who is happy with what he or she has."


The month before the High Holy Days, the month of Elul, is one of only two months in the Hebrew calendar without any holidays or commemorations. The reason, we learn, is so that we can begin the self-reflection that is necessary for the High Holy Days early, as ten days alone is not sufficient. We often focus our self-reflection on our transgressions, the things we need to fix in our lives, but it's important that we also take this time to think about our blessings, the things that are going right, and focus ourselves on ways that we can embrace those blessings and help to create more of them in our lives.

While we usually wish one another a Happy New Year, the Hebrew greeting for Rosh Hashana is "L'Shanah Tovah," "to a good year." Most of our holidays, however, take the greeting, "Chag Sameach," wishing each other a happy holiday. Similar to the Declaration of Independence, promising the pursuit of happiness rather than happiness itself, we don't expect for every moment of our year to be a happy one. May this be a year in which, in spite of any adversity or instability we face, we find countless moments of blessing and happiness and are able to feel rich in the happiness we choose to find in each of our lives. •

#### FROM THE CLERGY

The other day, a Bat Mitzvah student asked me, "Why do I have to learn all these prayers? I know I have to lead the service, but why these prayers?" It was an interesting question. Why was she learning these particular prayers?

In ancient times, prayers were not written down. In fact, worship of God was achieved through animal sacrifice, and the individual offered his own prayer. After the destruction of the Second Temple in 70 CE, our sages gathered the oral traditions and

eventually wrote them down, giving the structure and outline of the tradition. The first siddur (prayer book) was written in about 875 CE by Rabbi Amram ben Sheshna haGaon, the leader of the Talmudic Academy at Sura in Babylon. This particular siddur was written for the scholars of the time. One of his successors, Saadia Gaon, compiled a siddur for general use during the period 882-942 CE.

Once synagogue worship was established, one did not go to a teacher to learn the prayers of the service. Men attended services two to three times a day, and their sons went with them. It was the father's responsibility to make sure the boy learned Torah and the prayers of the service.

Today, most B'nai Mitzvah students spend several years in Religious School preparing for their big day. Sadly, attending services is no longer the norm with most families. Our lives have become too busy with work, school, sports, activities, and just getting from place to place. However, here at Temple, we do require our students to attend a set number of Friday and Saturday Shabbat services. We hope that by watching and listening, they will be more comfortable with their own service. I do notice that if students attend services more regularly, the prayers come easier to them.

I remember when my sons were younger, they would often accompany me to Friday evening services. Sometimes, I had to have them come with me because there was no one home to watch them; other times, they wanted to "go to work with Mom." I didn't think much about it at the time; I was just happy to see them out in the congregation. However, when it came time for their Bar Mitzvah tutoring, I discovered that they already knew 80 percent of the prayers they needed to learn. They had learned them simply by attending the services!

Lately, many of our congregants have begun streaming our Friday evening service. What a wonderful way to bring Shabbat into your home! Just tune in on our website and watch and listen online. It's a great way not only to bring Shabbat into your life but an excellent way for students to be able to listen to their prayers in a natural setting. I hope that many more congregants will stream the service when they can't make it to Temple.

So, what was my answer to my Bat Mitzvah student's question? "The prayers you are learning are the prayers that our people have used to pray on Shabbat for many hundreds of years. We selected these prayers so that one day you will be able to attend any Shabbat service almost anywhere in the world and be able to participate and feel comfortable. It is the beginning of your own personal connection to your Judaism."

May each of you find your own personal connection to your Judaism, a relationship that will bring you joy, comfort and fulfillment!




