

From the Clergy

The Great Thought Experiment

How a simple question led to one of the greatest literary achievements of all time

e have scientists and artists and engineers and economic gurus working every day throughout our civilization to design and build the future, but what would happen if we instead put all of our greatest thinkers together to solve the meaning of life?

Imagine for a moment that there was a civilization who gathered together 100 of their wisest, most brilliant minds, and put them all together in a room to once and for all solve the mystery of the universe, creation, and the purpose of human existence. Picture in your mind that they were given the task and sealed in a room for ten years to work without distraction. What amazing wonders would they discover? What awesome insights would they reveal? What profound secrets would they be able to unravel? Imagine that at the end of a decade, they emerge with a document compiled from their various approaches to the singular question – a record of their most important and productive

conversations and conclusions.

Wouldn't you want to read what it said? It turns out that there *is* such a civilization. Except they didn't send

100 of their best and brightest, and they didn't spend a decade on the endeavor. In reality, it was more like 800 years, and the diligent work was carried out by more than 1500 scholars over those generations. The document that they produced at the end is unique in the course of human achievements. It is a genre of literature unto itself, sui generis among all written works of all the civilizations of the world throughout history. It is comprised of 63 volumes, totaling 2,711 double-sided folios. The civilization that devoted centuries of its best and brightest minds to this singular endeavor is, of course, Judaism. The work that we created is called the Talmud, sometimes known as the Oral Torah.

The Talmud contains philosophy, theology, folklore, aphorisms, legal discourse, historical analysis, ethics, inspiring stories, love, tragedy, humor, as well as the ins and outs of daily life. It is globally recognized for its unique depth, sophistication, and ability to teach complex critical thinking. Some people have credited the Talmud with even the survival and success of the Jewish civilization. It has guided our people, whether eking out a life in a New York tenement or building the "start-up nation" of Israel.

The Talmud is studied by elite boarding school students in South Korea, in business leadership courses in Israel, and by finance moguls in China. The unique teachings and everyday wisdom of the Talmud make it perhaps humanity's best answer to the age-old questions of what our purpose is in this universe. However, mastering the text is no easy task. Reading at a careful pace of one page a day, the entire Talmud takes 7 ½ years to complete. This "Daf Yomi" cycle (daily page) begins again on January 5, and we will start to explore this exciting text here at Schaarai Zedek on Saturday mornings. When it comes to the Talmud, there are no true experts - we are all beginners. Begin with us or on your own. •

Rabbi Jack Bemporad is the director of the nonprofit Center for Interreligious Understanding (CIU), which he founded in 1992. It aims to bring people of all religious

faiths together to promote open dialogue, mutual respect, and theological understanding of the common foundations shared by the world's religions. Rabbi Bemporad began teaching at Vatican universities in 1998 and has been Director of the John Paul II Center and Professor of Interreligious Studies, both at the Pontifical University of St. Thomas Aguinas (Angelicum), in Rome since 2009. Concurrently, he also serves as Rabbi of Congregation Micah of New Jersey, in Cresskill.

Fleeing the fascist takeover in Italy prior to WWII, Bemporad and his family traveled to the U.S. when he was five years old. Thus, having personally suffered as the result of persecution and prejudice, he has dedicated his career to improving relations among Christians, Muslims, and Jews worldwide. Rabbi Bemporad is recognized internationally for his diplomatic skill and leadership in matters of religious understanding and reconciliation. He is one of the rare Jewish leaders to have had a personal audience with Pope John XXIII, numerous personal audiences with Pope John Paul II, and was one of three rabbis to have blessed him shortly before his death. Most recently, he met with Pope Francis at the conclusion of the "Refugees and Migrants" conference, co-sponsored by the CIU in Rome this past November.

From 1966-72, Rabbi Bemporad served as Chairman of the Interreligious Affairs Committee of the Synagogue Council of America. He was chief rabbi of Temple Emanu-El in Dallas from 1972-83 and concurrently served as Professor of Philosophy at Southern Methodist University during those years. He taught philosophy at Hebrew Union College in New York as well, from 1960-65, and from 1965-72 was Director of Worship and Adult Education for the Reform Movement, based in New York.

The Early Days of Schaarai Zedek

Excerpts from the minutes of the Temple Board*

January 20, 1895 **Pews and Seats**

Art.9 Sec.1. – The rental for pews and seats shall be fixed by the Trustees, but these pews and seats shall be sold yearly on the Sunday immediately preceding New Year - Rosh Hashanah – to the highest bidder, and the prices so realized shall be a premium in addition to the fixed price for the pews and seats.

Art.9 Sec.3. – Persons of either sex may occupy the same pew and the family of the pew-holder are entitled to seats in his pew.

January 27, 1895 From the by-laws: Duties of the Collector

Art. 8 – He shall have charge of the Synagogue and everything pertaining thereto, and shall keep the same in good order under the immediate direction of the Trustees. He shall collect all outstandings under direction of the Secretary, and shall perform such other duties as he may be directed to do by the President. He shall attend the Synagogue on all occasions of divine worship and see that it is kept in proper order....For the faithful performance of his services he shall receive such compensation as may be determined upon yearly by the Congregation at their annual meeting.




