Exodus 14:21-31

²¹And Moses stretched out his hand over the sea, and the Lord led the sea with the strong east wind all night, and He made the sea into dry land and the waters split. ²² Then the children of Israel came into the midst of the sea on dry land, and the waters were to them as a wall from their right and from their left. ²³ The Egyptians pursued and came after them all Pharaoh's horses, his chariots, and his horsemen, into the midst of the sea. ²⁴ It came about in the morning watch that the Lord looked down over the Egyptian camp through a pillar of fire and cloud, and He threw the Egyptian camp into confusion. ²⁵ And He removed the wheels of their chariots, and He led them with heaviness, and the Egyptians said, Let me run away from the Israelites because the Lord is fighting for them against the Egyptians. ²⁶ Thereupon, the Lord said to Moses, Stretch out your hand over the sea, and let the water return upon the Egyptians, upon their chariots, and upon their horsemen. ²⁷ So Moses stretched out his hand over the sea, and toward morning the sea returned to its strength, as the Egyptians were fleeing toward it, and the Lord stirred the Egyptians into the sea. ²⁸ And the waters returned and covered the chariots and the horsemen, the entire force of Pharaoh coming after them into the sea; not even one of them survived. ²⁹ But the children of Israel went on dry land in the midst of the sea, and the water was to them like a wall from their right and from their left. ³⁰ On that day the Lord saved Israel from the hand[s] of the Egyptians, and Israel saw the Egyptians dying on the seashore. ³¹ And Israel saw the great hand, which the Lord had used upon the Egyptians, and the people feared the Lord, and they believed in the Lord and in Moses, His servant.

Judges 5:1-5

¹ On that day Deborah and Barak son of Abinoam sang this victory song: ² "When the leaders took the lead in Israel, When the people answered the call to war - Praise Adonai! ³ Hear, O kings! Pay attention, O rulers! I will sing to God! I will sing to Adonai, the God of Israel! ⁴ Adonai, when You departed from Seir, when You marched from Edom's plains, the earth shook, the heavens poured down, the clouds poured down rain. ⁵ The mountains trembled before Adonai, the God of Sinai; before Adonai, the God of Israel.

Welcome to Congregation Schaarai Zedek's Saturday afternoon Shabbat service. Shabbat, the Jewish Sabbath, begins on Friday evening at dusk and concludes when there are three stars in the sky on Saturday evening. While Shabbat is a day of rest, our community joins in worship celebrating the themes of creation and God's original redemption of the Israelites from Egypt. A reading from the Torah (The Five Books of Moses) and a Haftarah from the Books of the Prophets are part of the Shabbat service.

The Bat Mitzvah, (literally child of the commandment), takes on a new understanding of responsibility and obligation, in their lives and in the Jewish community.
