From the Clergy

The World Zionist Congress Elections

The upcoming 2020 election marks a pivotal moment for Reform Jews across the world.

f you were to hear that I was writing about the importance of voting in an election, you might think I was talking about our own country's upcoming elections (and of course, everyone should be registered to vote). But this month, I'm writing about elections in Israel. While we as Americans can't vote between Labor, Likud, the Blue and White Party, or any other of Israel's nine parties represented in their last election (which is fewer than usual!), we do have the potential to make our voices heard.

Theodore Herzl created the World Zionist Congress (WZC) in 1897, and today it is made up of 500 delegates from around the world who gather once every five years. Among their responsibilities is the allocation of nearly \$1 billion a year for the five years between elections along with filling essential leadership positions among some of Israel's most prominent organizations.

I'm writing this month, asking you all to vote in this year's WZC elections. This election is a significant opportunity for the Reform Movement to have its voice heard concerning domestic policies in Israel.

According to its mission statement, the Association of Reform Zionists in America (ARZA) "unconditionally supports Israel and champions activities that further Israel as a pluralistic, just, and democratic Jewish state." That means that at a time when Israel has, unfortunately, become a divisive subject, ARZA aims to show how one can be ardently Zionist, regardless of politics, supporting the values of Reform Judaism.

A strong representation of the Reform movement in the World Zionist Organization (WZO) can help lead to funding for the Reform movement. While the government pays and funds Orthodox rabbis and synagogues, the same is not true for Conservative and Reform rabbis and synagogues. A few exceptions have been made over the past five years, but there is still far more work to do. Non-Orthodox weddings are not allowed to be performed in Israel, and a true equal, egalitarian space has still not been created at the Western Wall. The WZO is only a small piece of this puzzle, but it is an important

one in starting to move Israel forward to being a place in which we, as Reform Jews, are accepted next to our Orthodox brothers and sisters.

We are excited to plan a trip to Israel in the summer of 2022 (more information coming soon!). My hope is that when we visit, we will be visiting a country in which all forms of Judaism are able to thrive, a country in which men and women are able to find equal opportunities to have meaningful experiences, and a country that is continuing its mission of being, as is described in its 1948 Proclamation of Independence; "based on freedom, justice and peace as envisaged by the prophets of Israel; it will ensure complete equality of social and political rights to all its inhabitants irrespective of religion, race or sex; it will guarantee freedom of religion, conscience, language, education and culture."

Adult Education: Guest Speaker, Rabbi Jack Bemporad



Rabbi Jack Bemporad, Professor of Interreligious Studies at the Vatican's Angelicum University, will deliver several lectures at Schaarai Zedek and Saint Leo University during the first week of February 2020:

Rabbi Jack Bemporad is the director of the nonprofit Center for Interreligious Understanding (CIU), which he founded in 1992. It aims to bring people of all religious faiths together to promote open dialogue, mutual respect, and theological understanding of the common foundations shared by the world's religions. Rabbi Bemporad began teaching at Vatican universities in 1998 and has been Director of the John Paul II Center and Professor of Interreligious Studies, both at the Pontifical University of St. Thomas Aquinas (Angelicum), in Rome since 2009. Concurrently, he also serves as Rabbi of Congregation Micah of New Jersey, in Cresskill.

Fleeing the fascist takeover in Italy prior to WWII, Bemporad and his family traveled to the U.S. when he was five years old. Thus, having personally suffered as the result of persecution and prejudice, he has dedicated his career to improving relations among Christians, Muslims, and Jews worldwide. Rabbi Bemporad is recognized internationally for his diplomatic skill and leadership in matters of religious understanding and reconciliation. He is one of the rare Jewish leaders to have had a personal audience with Pope John XXIII, numerous personal audiences with Pope John Paul II, and was one of three rabbis to have blessed him shortly before his death. Most recently, he met with Pope Francis at the conclusion of the "Refugees and Migrants" conference, co-sponsored by the CIU in Rome this past November.

Merlot and Mysticism:

A Tu BiShvat Wine Tasting Experience Monday, February 10, 7:00 pm Cost: \$10 per person

A good bottle of wine has complexity and depth. The first sip doesn't necessarily give you the true sense of the wine you're tasting, as the wine changes its qualities as it's exposed to air. To fully experience a wine, you have to combine all of the senses. The Kabbalists, Jewish mystics, teach us that our world is like a fine glass of wine. There is the world we see at first glance, but there are hidden levels to our world that we can only see when we take the time to try to do so.

While we know Tu BiShvat as the "birthday of the trees," the Kabbalists of Safed embraced the holiday as a time to explore this way of looking at the world, while also incorporating four cups of wine, like the Passover seder, into their observance. At our wine tasting seder, we will combine the world of the mystics with that of the oenophile, learning a bit about Kabbalah and a bit about wine, as we enjoy a guided wine tasting (no Manischewitz!) along with the fruits and nuts that are traditional for Tu BiShvat. 

The Early Days of Schaarai Zedek

Excerpts from the minutes of the Temple Board*

February 26, 1905

...the President stated that he had called the meeting at the request of co-religionists, that Mrs. E.H. Strinberg had called on him, stating that Congregation Rodef Sholom intended purchasing a lot for a synagogue but before this was done she desired to see if ways and means could not be devised whereby the two Congregations could become affiliated and requested that committees be appointed from the congregations with this purpose in view.




