Leviticus, Chapter 6

¹ Then Adonai spoke to Moses: ² “Command Aaron and his sons, ‘This is the law of the burnt offering. The burnt offering is to remain on the hearth on the altar all night until morning, and the fire of the altar must be kept burning on it. ³ Then the priest must put on his linen robe and must put linen leggings over his bare flesh, and he must take up the fatty ashes of the burnt offering that the fire consumed on the altar, and he must place them beside the altar. ⁴ Then he must take off his clothes and put on other clothes, and he must bring the fatty ashes outside the camp to a ceremonially clean place, ⁵ but the fire which is on the altar must be kept burning on it. It must not be extinguished. So the priest must kindle wood on it morning by morning, and he must arrange the burnt offering on it and offer the fat of the peace offering up in smoke on it. ⁶ A continual fire must be kept burning on the altar. It must not be extinguished. ⁷ “This is the law of the grain offering. The sons of Aaron are to present it before Adonai in front of the altar, ⁸ and the priest must take up with his hand some of the choice wheat flour of the grain offering and some of its olive oil, and all of the frankincense that is on the grain offering, and he must offer its memorial portion up in smoke on the altar as a soothing aroma to Adonai. ⁹ Aaron and his sons are to eat what is left over from it. It must be eaten unleavened in a holy place; they are to eat it in the courtyard of the Meeting Tent. ¹⁰ It must not be baked with yeast. I have given it as their portion from my gifts. It is most holy, like the sin offering and the guilt offering. ¹¹ Every male among the sons of Aaron may eat it. It is a portion given continually, throughout your generations from the gifts of Adonai. Anyone who touches these gifts must be holy.”
