## Numbers 11:7-17

<sup>7</sup> Now the manna was shaped like coriander seed, and in color it was like crystal. <sup>8</sup> The people would go about and gather it, grind it between millstones or pound it in a mortar, boil it in a pot, and make it into cakes. It tasted like rich cream. <sup>9</sup> When the dew fell on the camp at night, the manna would fall upon it. <sup>10</sup> Moses heard the people weeping in family groups, each man at the entrance of his tent. The Lord was very angry, and Moses was distressed. <sup>11</sup> And Moses said to Adonai, “Why have You made things bad for Your servant, and why have I not enjoyed Your favor, that You have laid the burden of all this people upon me? <sup>12</sup> Did I father this entire people, did I give birth to them, that You tell me, ‘Carry them to your chest as a nurse carries an infant,’ even into the land that You have promised on oath to their ancestors? <sup>13</sup> Where am I to get meat to give to all this people? For they are whining to me, saying, ‘Give us meat to eat!’ <sup>14</sup> I am unable to bear the burden of this entire people by myself; they have become too burdensome for me. <sup>15</sup> And if You do this to them, let me die now if You regard me favorably, so that I do not see their misfortune. <sup>16</sup> Adonai then said to Moses, “Gather for Me seventy men of the elders of Israel, whom you recognize as being the people’s elders and its officers, and you shall take them to the Tent of Meeting and they shall stand there together with you. <sup>17</sup> I will then descend and speak with you there, and I will draw upon the spirit that is on you and put it upon them; they shall share the burden of the people with you, and you shall not bear it alone.

## Zechariah 2: 14 – 17

<sup>14</sup> “Sing joyfully and be glad, fair Zion: for behold, I am coming to dwell in your midst!” says the Eternal One. <sup>15</sup> “On that day, many nations shall join themselves to Adonai, and become My people, and I will dwell in your midst.” Then you shall know that the God of heaven’s hosts has sent me to you. <sup>16</sup> Adonai will take possession of Judah - God’s portion in the holy land - and will again choose Jerusalem. <sup>17</sup> Be silent, all flesh, before Adonai, who is roused from God’s [own] holy dwelling place!
