Numbers, Chapter 22

²¹ Balaam rose up in the morning, and saddled his donkey, and went with the princes of Moab. ²² Then God's anger was kindled because he went, and the angel of Adonai stood in the road to oppose him. Now he was riding on his donkey and his two servants were with him. ²³ And the donkey saw the angel of God standing in the road with his sword drawn in his hand, so the donkey turned aside from the road and went into the field. But Balaam beat the donkey, to make her turn back to the road. ²⁴ Then the angel of God stood in a path among the vineyards, where there was a wall on either side. ²⁵ And when the donkey saw the angel of Adonai, she pressed herself into the wall, and crushed Balaam's foot against the wall. So he beat her again.

²⁶ Then the angel of God went farther, and stood in a narrow place, where there was no way to turn either to the right or to the left. ²⁷ When the donkey saw the angel of Adonai, she crouched down under Balaam. Then Balaam was angry, and he beat his donkey with a staff.

²⁸ Then Adonai opened the mouth of the donkey, and she said to Balaam, "What have I done to you that you have beaten me these three times?" ²⁹ And Balaam said to the donkey, "You have made me look stupid; I wish there were a sword in my hand, for I would kill you right now." ³⁰ The donkey said to Balaam, "Am I not your donkey that you have ridden ever since I was yours until this day? Have I ever attempted to treat you this way?" And he said, "No." ³¹ Then Adonai opened Balaam's eyes, and he saw the angel of God standing in the way with his sword drawn in his hand; so he bowed his head and threw himself down with his face to the ground. ³² The angel of God said to him, "Why have you beaten your donkey these three times? Look, I came out to oppose you because what you are doing is perverse before me. ³³ The donkey saw me and turned from me these three times. If she had not turned from me, I would have killed you but saved her alive."

Micah, Chapter 6

² Hear God's accusation, you mountains, you enduring foundations of the earth. For Adonai has a case against God's people; Adonai has a dispute with Israel! ³ "My people, how have I wronged you? How have I wearied you? Answer me! ⁴ In fact, I brought you up from the land of Egypt; I delivered you from that place of slavery. I sent Moses, Aaron, and Miriam to lead you. ⁵ My people, recall how King Balak of Moab planned to harm you, how Balaam son of Beor responded to him. Recall how you journeyed from Shittim to Gilgal, so you might acknowledge that Adonai has treated you fairly."
