Numbers 11:7-17

¹ Miriam and Aaron began to talk against Moses because of his Cushite wife, for he had married a Cushite. ² “Has Adonai spoken only through Moses?” they asked. “Hasn’t God also spoken through us?” And Adonai heard this. ³ Now Moses was a very humble man, more humble than anyone else on the face of the earth. ⁴ At once Adonai said to Moses, Aaron and Miriam, “Come out to the Tent of Meeting, all three of you.” So the three of them went out. ⁵ Then Adonai came down in a pillar of cloud; the Lord stood at the entrance to the tent and summoned Aaron and Miriam. When the two of them stepped forward, ⁶ Adonai said, “Listen to my words: “When there is a prophet among you, I, Adonai, reveal myself to them in visions, I speak to them in dreams. ⁷ But this is not true of my servant Moses; he is faithful in all my house. ⁸ With him, I speak face to face, clearly and not in riddles; he sees the form of Adonai. Why then were you not afraid to speak against my servant Moses?” ⁹ The anger of the Lord burned against them, and Adonai left them. ¹⁰ When the cloud lifted from above the tent, Miriam’s skin was leprous—it became as white as snow. Aaron turned toward her and saw that she had a defiling skin disease, ¹¹ and he said to Moses, “Please, my lord, I ask you not to hold against us the sin we have so foolishly committed. ¹² Do not let her be like a stillborn infant coming from its mother’s womb with its flesh half eaten away.” ¹³ So Moses cried out to Adonai, “Please, God, heal her!”

Zechariah 2:14-17

¹⁴ “Sing joyfully and be glad, fair Zion: for behold, I am coming to dwell in your midst!” says the Eternal One. ¹⁵ “On that day, many nations shall join themselves to Adonai, and become My people, and I will dwell in your midst.” Then you shall know that the God of heaven’s hosts has sent me to you. ¹⁶ Adonai will take possession of Judah - God’s portion in the holy land - and will again choose Jerusalem. ¹⁷ Be silent, all flesh, before Adonai, who is roused from God’s [own] holy dwelling place!

Welcome to Congregation Schaarai Zedek's Saturday afternoon Shabbat service. Shabbat, the Jewish Sabbath, begins on Friday evening at dusk and concludes when there are three stars in the sky on Saturday evening.
