## Deuteronomy, Chapter 30:1-14

<sup>1</sup> “When the time arrives that all these things have come upon you, both the blessing and the curse which I have presented to you; and you are there among the nations to which Adonai your God has driven you; then, at last, you will start thinking about what has happened to you; <sup>2</sup> and you will return to Adonai your God and pay attention to what God has said, which will be exactly what I am ordering you to do today — you and your children, with all your heart and all your being. <sup>3</sup> At that point, Adonai your God will reverse your exile and show you mercy; Adonai will return and gather you from all the peoples to which Adonai your God scattered you. <sup>4</sup> If one of yours was scattered to the far end of the sky, Adonai your God will gather you even from there; God will go there and get you. <sup>5</sup> Adonai your God will bring you back into the land your ancestors possessed, and you will possess it; Adonai will make you prosper there, and you will become even more numerous than your ancestors. <sup>6</sup> Then Adonai your God will circumcise your hearts and the hearts of your children, so that you will love Adonai your God with all your heart and all your being, and thus you will live. <sup>7</sup> Adonai your God will put all these curses on your enemies, on those who hated and persecuted you; <sup>8</sup> But you will return and pay attention to what Adonai says and obey all God’s commandments which I am giving you today. <sup>9</sup> Then Adonai your God will give you more than enough in everything you set out to do — the fruit of your body, the fruit of your livestock, and the fruit of your land will all do well; for Adonai will once again rejoice to see you do well, just as God rejoiced in your ancestors. <sup>10</sup> However, all this will happen only if you pay attention to what Adonai your God says, so that you obey God’s commandments and laws which are written in this book of the Torah, if you turn to Adonai your God with all your heart and all your being. <sup>11</sup> For this commandment which I am giving you today is not too hard for you, it is not beyond your reach. <sup>12</sup> It isn’t in the sky, so that you need to ask, “Who will go up into the sky for us, bring it to us and make us hear it, so that we can obey it?” <sup>13</sup> Likewise, it isn’t beyond the sea, so that you need to ask, “Who will cross the sea for us, bring it to us and make us hear it, so that we can obey it?” <sup>14</sup> On the contrary, the word is very close to you — in your mouth, even in your heart; therefore, you can do it!

## Isaiah, Chapter 61:10-62:3

<sup>10</sup> I am so joyful in Adonai! My soul rejoices in my God, for God has clothed me in salvation, dressed me with a robe of triumph, like a bridegroom wearing a festive turban, like a bride adorned with her jewels. <sup>11</sup> For just as the earth brings forth its plants, or a garden makes its plants spring up, so will Adonai, God, cause victory and glory to spring up before all nations. <sup>1</sup> For Zion’s sake I will not be silent, for Jerusalem’s sake I will not rest, until her vindication shines out brightly and her salvation like a blazing torch. <sup>2</sup> The nations will see your vindication and all kings your glory. Then you will be called by a new name which Adonai will pronounce. <sup>3</sup> You will be a glorious crown in the hand of Adonai, a royal diadem held by your God.

Welcome to Congregation Schaarai Zedek's Saturday morning Shabbat service. Shabbat, the Jewish Sabbath, begins on Friday evening at dusk and concludes when there are three stars in the sky on Saturday evening. While Shabbat is a day of rest, our community joins in worship celebrating the themes of creation and God's original redemption of the Israelites from Egypt. A reading from the Torah (The Five Books of Moses) and a Haftarah from the Books of the Prophets are part of the Shabbat service.
