Numbers 16:1-10

¹ Now Korah, son of Izhar, the son of Kohath, the son of Levi, and Dathan and Abiram, the sons of Eliab, and On son of Peleth, who were Reubenites, took men ² and rebelled against Moses, along with some of the Israelites, 250 leaders of the community, chosen from the assembly, famous men. ³ And they assembled against Moses and Aaron, saying to them, “You take too much upon yourselves, seeing that the whole community is holy, every one of them, and Adonai is among them. Why then do you exalt yourselves above the community of Adonai?” ⁴ When Moses heard it he fell down with his face to the ground. ⁵ Then he said to Korah and to all his company, “In the morning Adonai will make known who are God’s, and who is holy. Adonai will cause that person to approach God; the person God has chosen Adonai will cause to approach God. ⁶ Do this, Korah, you and all your company: Take censers, ⁷ put fire in them, and set incense on them before Adonai tomorrow, and the man whom Adonai chooses will be holy. You take too much upon yourselves, you sons of Levi!” ⁸ Moses said to Korah, “Listen now, you sons of Levi! ⁹ Does it seem too small a thing to you that the God of Israel has separated you from the community of Israel to bring you near to Adonai, to perform the service of the tabernacle of Adonai, and to stand before the community to minister to them? ¹⁰ God has brought you near and all your brothers, the sons of Levi, with you. Do you now seek the priesthood also?

1 Samuel 12:13-15

¹³ Now look! Here is the king you have chosen—the one that you asked for! Look, Adonai has given you a king! ¹⁴ If you fear Adonai, serve and obey Adonai, and don’t rebel against what Adonai says, and if both you and the king who rules over you follow Adonai your God, all will be well. ¹⁵ But if you don’t obey God and rebel against what Adonai says, the hand of God will be against both you and your king.

Welcome to Congregation Schaarai Zedek's Saturday morning Shabbat service. Shabbat, the Jewish Sabbath, begins on Friday evening at dusk and concludes when there are three stars in the sky on Saturday evening. While Shabbat is a day of rest, our community joins in worship celebrating the themes of creation and God's original redemption of the Israelites from Egypt.
