

## Pirkei Pickleball

### Where the Wisdom of Our Ancestors Meets Today's Hottest Sport

hile as faculty at Camp Coleman this summer, we were given the opportunity to create an elective for

the 8th-10th graders, bringing to camp something about which we were passionate through which we could teach the campers Jewish values. "What," I asked my campers, "could possibly be Jewish about pickleball?"

Yes, I've recently become hooked on America's fastest growing sport, and I took this opportunity to teach the kids the basics (building my own makeshift court in the center of camp) and the Iewish lessons that could inform it.

I began by teaching the concept of *shatnez*, the prohibition of mixing linen and cotton, comparing it to pickleball's origin as a combination of tennis, badminton, and table tennis. Just as Rabbi Gunther Plaut suggested that *shatnez* is "very strange to us in a post-Darwinian age," we too decided the sport could still be kosher in spite of this ancient

law. (After all, how could a pickle not be kosher?!) I went on to teach values of patience and sportsmanship we can learn from Pirkei Avot, the 2,000-yearold work of wisdom from the Rabbis, but ultimately I settled on the text above from the Book of Joel.

"At 42 years old," I explained, "I literally sit in the middle of the pickleball world."

The kids laughed, probably because in the camp environment it was difficult to imagine anyone older than me, but I continued explaining that the fastest growing demographic of players are only slightly older than they were, at 18-34, while the 55+ pickleballers still dominate the court.

"In what other active sport," I asked the kids, "can you play your grandparents, and they would most likely have the advantage?"

I went on to teach them the strategy of "dinking," the up-close net game most often perfected by the older generation of players, leading to frustration in those younger players trying to play a faster, miniature version of tennis, ignoring the finesse of the game.

"The ideal," I explained utilizing the prophecy of Joel, "is to master both parts of the game, using the gifts of agility of one's youth next to the strategy and patience that comes with the wisdom of age."

As I spoke of the mingling of the

generations that can occur on the pickleball court, I couldn't help but think of the same occurring within our congregation's walls.

One of my greatest joys during our High Holy Days and on Friday evenings is seeing different generations of a family coming together in our sanctuary, finding the comfort of the traditions of generations past and embracing the ways those traditions have changed in modern times. Here, too, the gifts of each generation can come together, creating a place in which we all can learn and teach one another different perspectives, engaging in a shared experience together.

As we approach these High Holy Days, we too will see traditions that have been a part of our congregation for decades mingled with customs that are becoming our tradition, each stemming from the ritual that has been ever evolving throughout our people's history. Just as a sport can evolve into something new, so too has Jewish tradition taken from the modern world around it in an ongoing chain of change leading us to our Judaism today.

Whether in our sanctuary, on a pickleball court, in our homes or out in the world, may each generation give to and take from the others, learning, growing, and continuing to change, as we each aspire to evolve into our best selves in this new year of 5784.



# High Holy Days, Low Holy Days, and Everything In Between

ell, it's that time of year again! The High Holy Days come around again every year with our longest prayer services of the year,

our stuffiest outfits, and non-stop (often agonizing) self-reflection. Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur, for many, are the apex of the Jewish calendar and, perhaps, the focus of their Jewish lives.

And I get why. The High Holy Days are a time to join the larger community in the important work of setting the tone for a whole new year. The ritual and services ask us to commit to profound personal change and can serve as a kind of therapy for the soul. And, let's be honest, who doesn't love a huge family break-fast at the end of a long Yom Kippur day?

But what if I were to tell you that our calendar can be so much more?

The entire year that we begin at Rosh Hashanah is punctuated with holiday after holiday that draws our attention to different issues at different moments and helps us experience our Jewish lives fully and deeply. With so many holidays that are dense with meaning, maybe this is the year to try celebrating something we haven't before.

#### **Sukkot**

For example, my favorite holiday is not as big a deal as it should be because it happens right after the High Holy Days, when even clergy can feel a little "templed out." Once the Gates of Forgiveness close on Yom Kippur, Jews around the world head to their yards or balconies or lanais and build a little hut: a sukkah!

Yes, I am one of those guys who's really into Sukkot. You get to build something with your own two hands, enjoy time outdoors with family and friends, and shake special plants, the lulav and etrog. How often do you get to shake a plant at God?!?! Well, only during Sukkot.

Sukkot, through dwelling in a fragile hut, reminds us of our vulnerability to the elements and our reliance on nature's bounty. It asks us to think of people who have no home in which to dwell and to invite guests, those in need in all kinds of ways, to join us in friendship. There are so many layers of meaning to Sukkot but something is refreshing about a holiday we get to spend outside in the fresh air.

This year, like the last, we'll be hosting programs nearly every day of Sukkot and I hope you'll join us. And if you want some tips on celebrating your own Sukkot at home, give us a call and we'll be happy to give you some building tips!

#### **The Ninth of Adar**

Now let's get a little more obscure. Did you know Judaism has a holiday encouraging destructive disagreement? Well, it's on the ninth day of the month of Adar and, despite being mentioned in many rabbinic texts, it seems to have not been observed through most of Jewish history. But I think we can agree that our current age demands a holiday asking us to engage in good faith debate for the public good.

The ninth of Adar commemorates the day on which the once congenial disagreements between the students of Beit Hillel and the students of Beit Shammai exploded into violence. We are told that 3,000 students were killed. Some Jewish thinkers and organizations have decided that this holiday presents an exceptional opportunity to talk about how we talk to each other and a warning that argument can quickly turn to bloodshed when we stop arguing for the right reasons. Maybe even Schaarai Zedek will celebrate the ninth of Adar this year!

## The Power of Jewish Teen Engagement: Why Should Your Teen Attend Fall Kallah?

Jewish teen engagement plays a pivotal role in shaping the future of the Jewish community, instilling a sense of identity, pride, and commitment among middle and high schoolers.

At Schaarai Zedek, our teens have the opportunity to engage with their Judaism in many different ways. One of the biggest avenues is through our youth groups, SchZFTY (high school) and Jr. SchZFTY (middle school). SchZFTY gives our teens a space to be themselves, explore their connection to Judaism, and build a strong community of Jewish teens from around Tampa.

Our congregation is part of the larger Reform Jewish community, connecting us with synagogues from across North America. Part of this community is the 19 regions of the North American Federation of Temple Youth (NFTY). SchZFTY is in NFTY-STR, the Southern Tropical Region, comprised of South and Central Florida. Twice annually, NFTY-STR hosts a weekendlong retreat for 8th-12th graders (a "Kallah").

These weekends are social events with opportunities for learning, social action, and leadership. They are an excellent opportunity to spend time with Sunday School and camp friends, as well as meet

Jewish teens from across Florida. We are so excited to announce that we will be hosting NFTY-STR's Fall Kallah at Schaarai Zedek in October!

SchZFTY and NFTY offer a safe and inclusive space where teens can explore their connection to Judaism and develop a deeper understanding of their identity, fostering a sense of pride in their Jewish roots. In addition to individual exploration, teens engaged in Jewish communities build strong connections and interpersonal relationships. NFTY emphasizes the importance of community and connection, creating a network of like-minded peers who share common values and experiences. Through these connections, teens develop lifelong friendships and a sense of belonging that extends beyond geographical and cultural boundaries.

For all these reasons and more, we are excited to host NFTY-STR's Fall Kallah here at Schaarai Zedek from October 20-22, 2023! By providing these teens with meaningful experiences, educational opportunities, and a strong sense of belonging, we at Schaarai Zedek can create a vibrant and lasting impact on the lives of these young participants.

In addition to promoting our teen participation, we also need some help from our larger Schaarai Zedek community! Fall Kallah will be a "home-hosted" event, meaning we are opening our homes for the participants to stay in on Friday (October 20) and Saturday (October 21) night. 
