Being Present in Every Inning

'm one of those people for whom having the TV on can be a helpful aid in falling asleep, but it has to be the right kind of television. Downton Abbey is one of my favorites (there's something about the accents...), but during the summer, baseball is the perfect soporific.

And so it was that I found myself with a Mets-Dodgers game on one evening, just past midnight. The game didn't do its job though, and I found myself watching a close game intently, only for the Mets to take a 6-0 lead after a huge eighth inning. But it was the top of the ninth inning, as I was still awake, that got my attention.

Yes, the Mets had the game more or less put away, but nonetheless I was surprised, disturbed even, to see the Mets players flipping a water bottle in the dugout while their teammate was batting. You may know the game - you take a partially full water bottle, flip it, and try to get it to land upright. The announcers were loving it, ecstatic to show Juan Soto ultimately succeeding in the task, but I found myself wondering why, even though

they were well ahead, wasn't the team paying attention to their teammate who was at the plate.

Sure, this is a silly example, but it is baseball season, and it got me thinking about what it means to be present for a friend, family member, or our community, regardless of the proverbial inning or score of the game.

At a shiva minyan, I often share with the mourners that while their friends will head home when the evening is over, we remain there for them. We will continue to reach out, perhaps more than needed, but the alternative is possible as well, and even if the call or text isn't made, we remain present. We remain available for anything needed. As we return to our lives, it might look like we're "flipping water bottles," but our love and care remains, and we want to be present if our presence is desired.

The same is true in any time of need. When we need support, we may look at our friends and family, see them enjoying life, and not want to trouble them with our problems. We might even be upset or disappointed that they're not there for us. But acknowledging that our support

system isn't simply sitting in the dugout but rather are "up to bat" in their own lives, sometimes we have to make that call to let them know that we need them.

Please know that the same is always true from us, your Schaarai Zedek family. We are always here for each of you, in times of joy or times of need, any time you want us lifting you up or cheering you on. As we continue to develop our Caring Committee, we, as a congregation, want to be there for you! As always, you can reach out to clergy or staff at any time, and whether volunteering to be part of that presence, or if you need that support, you can reach out at caring@zedek.org

It's easy to miss the moments when someone needs us, when they're "up to bat" and just hoping someone's watching. And sometimes, we're the ones standing there, quietly hoping someone notices.

As we strive to be more present, for those closest to us, for our greater community, and perhaps, even for ourselves, your Schaarai Zedek family is always here.

Our Hunger for Connection

n the year 2000, when many thought the world was going to end in some kind of computer-induced societal breakdown, Michel Poulain, a Belgian demographer and professor, introduced the idea of "blue zones." Blue zones, Poulain proposes, are places in the world where people live past the age 100 due to "maintaining a traditional lifestyle implying an intense physical activity that extends beyond the age of 80, a reduced level of stress and intensive family and community support for their oldest olds." An American author, Dan Buettner, has carried the torch for this idea, writing books and producing documentaries advocating for bringing some of the values of these blue zones to other parts of the world.

One particular characteristic of one of these blue zones captivated me. On the Japanese island of Okinawa, parents place their children in a five-person social group called a *moai* with the expectation that they will spend their life-journeys together. At every stage of their lives, they celebrate each other's successes, care for each other's families when someone gets sick or dies, and support each other

financially when needed. Their lives are intertwined until the end; an end that comes later than most other places in the world, with women having an average life expectancy of approximately 90.

Doctors and scientists tell us there are lots of ways to extend our lives: diet, exercise, mental stimulation, lessening stress. It's also clear that we need to be connected to other people in the same way we need to eat or breathe. Being with other people who share your joys and sorrows, who lift you up and help you, who are invested in what happens to you, is not a novel idea. Jewish tradition discovered the benefits of being part of a close community based on shared values a long, long time ago. We see this at the very beginning of the Torah. In the story of the creation of the world, humankind's first crisis is that Adam is lonely, so God makes a partner for him. "It is not good for the Human to be alone" is a verse we should keep in our pockets. "Do not separate yourself from the community," says Rabbi Hillel at the turn of the first millennium, and, "If I am only for myself, what am I?" Each of us has a missing piece that other people hold, and we can't find it unless we seek them out and connect.

If only there were some place where people gather with shared purpose for social interaction and building supportive lifelong relationships based on shared moral values. That's right! I'm talking about spin class. Oh, wait! How about the synagogue? While our destinies might not be intertwined from the very start (unless you are one of the babies born into our community), our congregation is a place where we work to alleviate the epidemic of loneliness, where people meet and connect through learning, prayer, and simply spending time together. The hope is that these connections grow and endure even outside of the walls of the synagogue.

In a perfect world, everyone would have their temple people on speed dial. If you haven't found your temple people yet, come to Schaarai Zedek and we'll help you find them! I don't have any peer-reviewed research on this, and I think for legal reasons, I can't guarantee a longer lifespan through participation in communal Jewish life. I can guarantee a more meaningful life, surrounded by kind, thoughtful people who will be there for you when you need it. Maybe then Tampa will be the world's next blue zone.


